	225. STUDENTS AND THE POLICE		
1. <u>Purpose</u>	The Board recognizes that compulsory attendance laws impose on the Board the custodianship of the public school children of the district while they are present in the schools.		
2. <u>Authority</u>	When police request permission to interrogate a stu- dent at school, the principal shall request that any per- son conducting such interrogation be in plain clothes where possible; determine why such interrogation could not occur at the student's home; and attempt to inform the student's parents.		
	Whenever the Superintendent or delegate has determined that the police have a legitimate purpose in interrogating a child within the confines of a school building, the principal or his/her representative shall be present throughout the proceedings.		
	When the police request permission to arrest a student at school, the principal shall inform the Superintendent in writing; to the degree possible, determine why such arrest could not be made at the student's home; attempt to inform the student's parents; and request and inspect the arrest warrant.		
	No child shall be released to police authorities without proper warrant, appropriate evidence or written parental permission, except in the event of emergency or for the protection of life or proprety as determined by the principal.
