More facts when speaking to your legislatures about House Bill 526 and Senate Bill 34 regarding funding reform for Cyber Schools

- 1. Line Mountain is one of More than 150 districts have already developed their own high-quality cyber programs to provide students with a wide variety of learning options.
- 2. Line Mountain's cyber school can provide our own online learning programs for regular and special education at one-third (1/3) the costs for cyber charter tuition.
- 3. The reform provided under these bills offer real relief to school districts that are mandated to pay tuition to charter schools they did not authorize to the tune of over \$500,000.00 annually.
- 4. The savings stay within the districts, benefiting all of our students while controlling costs.
- Pennsylvania Public School Districts paid cyber charter schools more than \$463 million in 2016-17.
- 6. More than 100 school districts paid cyber charter tuition payments of greater than \$1 million. The average total cyber charter school tuition payment made by a district was \$926,000.
- 7. The average cyber charter tuition rate for a regular education student is \$11,306, yet district-run cyber programs averaged about \$5,000 per student Line Mountain's cyber tuition is \$3,188.00.
- 8. Special education students attending cyber charters cost \$24,200 per year in tuition with a maximum rate of \$48,198 per student.
- 9. More than 390 school districts were forced to pay more than \$20,000 per student for special education students attending cyber charters; whereas, Line Mountain Cyber charged \$3,188.00.
